School Sport

Springfield Primary Academy has always provided a wide variety of sports through lessons or as club activities. Our teaching staff receive high quality training as they have some sessions working alongside specialist PE coaches. All children from Year 1 onwards experience a wide variety of games activities and also have the opportunity to take part in one focused sports festival during the year through our partnership with local primary schools. These focus sports include tag rugby, basketball, multi-skills and rounders. Children who exhibit a talent in the festival go on to attend a Gifted and Talented session.

The school also takes part in competitions with other local schools, which include football, netball, swimming, athletics, dodgeball and basketball.

What is the Sports Premium Grant?

The Sports Premium Grant is additional funding from the Government to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. It is also to be used for improving the health and wellbeing of primary pupils.

How much is the Sports Premium Grant?

Allocations for the academic year 2016-2017 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6 and those age 5 in Reception, as recorded in the January 2016 census.

At Springfield Primary Academy we received £9265 for the academic year 2016-2017.

How is the Sports Premium Grant being spent?

This grant is being used to improve provision for all of our pupils in the following ways:
