Sport Premium Funding Expenditure Report 2017-2018

School Sport

Springfield Primary Academy will continue to provide a fantastic sports programme through our high quality curriculum, festivals for all and sporting competitions for the gifted and talented pupils. This year all teaching staff will receive high quality CPD on a half termly basis working alongside specialist PE coaches from Pivotal Skills. All children from Year 1 onwards experience a wide variety of games, gym and dance curriculum and also have the opportunity to take part in one focused sports festival during the year through our Sports 4 All alliance with local primary schools. These focus sports include tag rugby, basketball, indoor athletics, multi-skills and rounders. Children who exhibit a talent in the festival go on to attend a Gifted and Talented session. We continue to encourage more children to take part in our out of school activity programmes adding new sports this year; archery, fencing, badminton, didgeball and kurling. We are also committed to children being active at break times and lunchtimes to support C4L guidance. The Academy has employed a member of staff from Pivotal Skills to run an active 30 club each lunchtime which is rotated between the KS2 classes.

What is the Sports Premium Grant?

The Sports Premium Grant is additional funding from the Government to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. It is also to be used for improving the health and wellbeing of primary pupils.

How much is the Sports Premium Grant?

Allocations for the academic year 2017-2018 are calculated using the number of pupils in Years 1 to 6 and those age 5 in Reception, as recorded in the January 2017 census. Each school has also been funded extra through the government's sugar tax increasing the total to approximately £18,000.

How is the Sports Premium Grant being spent?

This grant is being used to improve provision for all of our pupils in the following ways, we will review impact at the end of the academic year.
